2015/16 highlights

This report highlights the activities of Grange Big Local in the year from 2015 to 2016.

This has been a phase of awareness-raising, development from a steering group to a partnership board with a memorandum of understanding, appointing a worker, developing a plan, gaining Local Trust endorsement and starting to deliver on the plan.

New steering group members welcomed along with Julie Pal, who came to the meeting from CommUNITY Barnet, the new Locally Trusted Organisation

April 2015

Partnership Board appointed

Donation made to Age UK Barnet in recognition of support for Grange Big Local

June 2015

Survey on community hub developed to ascertain views of local people News of single community hub announced, a key achievement for Grange Big Local

August 2015

Jon Woolfson took up position of Community Partnership Manager for Grange Big Local, its first paid worker

September 2015

Grange Big Local's third annual festival took place at Bishop Douglass School with sponsorship from Haven Estate Agents

February 2016


Grange Big Local Plan submitted

Accounts

Martin School was Grange Big Local's Locally Trusted organisation from 2013 to 2015, managing Grange Big Local's financials. This chart gives a breakdown of spend of Getting Started money (£20,000) in this period.



The table below gives a breakdown of Pathway funding spend through CommUNITY Barnet in the year to the end of March 2016. The income to this Locally Trusted Organisation in this period comprised £18,000, detailed below. There was also a grant of £2,000 towards creating the Big Local plan, additional to the £1 million. Grange Big Local also brought in £200 of sponsorship for a community festival.




